### Understanding—According to Your Word

Introduction: Psalm 119:169, "Let my cry come before You, O Lord, give me understanding according to Your word."

#### FOUR ASPECTS OF UNDERSTANDING

• God-Given Insight:

Understanding is often presented as a gift from God:

Example: Sons of Issachar, 1 Chronicles 12:32, "...men who had understanding of the times, to know what Israel ought to do."

Application of Knowledge:

It's not just about knowing facts (knowledge):

Discernment and Judgment:

Understanding involves the ability to discern between good and evil:

Hebrews 5:14, "But solid food is for the mature, for those who have their powers of discernment trained by constant practice to distinguish good from evil." Example: Joseph, Genesis 50:20, "You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives."

• Spiritual and Moral Dimensions:

Biblical understanding encompasses both the intellectual:

Example: Solomon, 1 Kings 3:9, "Give Your servant therefore an understanding mind to govern Your people, that I may discern between good and evil, for who is able to govern this Your great people?"

Characteristics of Understanding:

1) It is required for:

Deuteronomy 1:13, "Choose some wise, understanding and respected men from each of your tribes, and I will set them over you."

Ezra 8:16, "Then I sent for Eliezer, Ariel, Shemaiah, Elnathan, Jarib, Elnathan, Nathan, Zechariah, and Meshullam, leaders; also for Joiarib and Elnathan, men of understanding."

Deuteronomy 4:6, "Observe them carefully, for this will show your wisdom and understanding to the nations, who will hear about all these decrees and say, 'Surely this great nation is a wise and understanding people.'"

2 Chronicles 26:5, "He sought God in the days of Zechariah, who had understanding in the visions of God; and as long as he sought the Lord, God made him prosper."

Nehemiah 8:2, "So Ezra the priest brought the Law before the assembly of men and women and all who *could* hear with understanding on the first day of the seventh month."

Psalm 32:9, "Do not be like the horse *or* like the mule, *Which* have no understanding, Which must be harnessed with bit and bridle, Else they will not come near you."
